


Under 43 CFR, Part 2, §2.28(a), you have the right to file an administrative FOIA appeal by sending an appeal request to:

A FOIA appeal must be made in writing. It must be received no later than 30 workdays from the date of your final letter responding to your FOIA request. Appeals arriving or delivered after 5 p.m. E.T., Monday through Friday, will be deemed received on the next workday. All communications concerning your appeal should be marked "FREEDOM OF INFORMATION APPEAL." It should clearly state the issue(s) that are being appealed with as much detail as possible as to the reason you believe the bureau's response is in error. The appeal must include copies of all correspondence between you and the bureau including your initial FOIA request and this denial letter. Failure to include this documentation with your appeal will result in the Department's rejection of your appeal. Also, be sure to include your contact information. This will insure the FOIA Appeals Officer will be able to contact you if they have any questions regarding your appeal.
